I am honored to serve as this year's President of the Junior League of Tallahassee. First, I would like to start by thanking our members, sponsors, donors, and the Tallahassee community. Your support allows us to make meaningful changes in the lives of children and families through the effective action and leadership of our trained volunteers.

As I reflect on last year's successes, I am grateful for your support and participation at League fundraisers like the Little Black Dress Initiative, Golf Classic, and Bold Sips. Through grants, sponsorships, and the generosity of donors like you, we kicked off the 2021-22 League year with the 25th Anniversary of Kids' Boutique, helping equip 171 elementary students with back-to-school supplies and clothing. We were also able to continue our work fighting food insecurity by distributing nearly 30,000 meals to feed families over the 2022 spring break through Mighty Meals.

I would also like to thank Capital City Youth Services for their partnership. As the 2020-2022 Jill Pope Community Partner, CCYS opened its doors to our volunteers and gave us the opportunity to help Big Bend at-risk youth and their families. In addition to our community impact, our members continued to expand our Training & Development arm. Our Public Affairs Committee won the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI) Public Policy & Advocacy award in May, for our work developing an advocacy plan and implementing a certificate training track for members, bringing recognition to the work our League does on an international stage.

Finally, we fully launched our new branding, which aligns us with AJLI. We are thrilled to have embraced the red, and I am excited to introduce you to the new branding in this Report!

As you read through the Annual Report, I hope the JLT Impact shines through. We look forward to continuing to expand our local footprint and continue to make an impact with you on our side.

PROGRAMS AND HIGHLIGHTS

HOPE COMMUNITY

This year continued the successful partnership with Big Bend Homeless Coalition's HOPE Community, which provides emergency shelter to families with minor children.

JLT launched a partnership with the Big Bend Homeless Coalition's HOPE Community in 2017. HOPE Community provides temporary housing, case management, and support services for families with minor children moving out of homelessness and into stable housing within the Big Bend area.

In addition, League members unanimously voted HOPE Community as our new 2022-2025 Strategic Community Partnership.





TEEN BOARD

Teen Board offers high school age junior and senior women from all local high schools a foundation of service and leadership, providing the opportunity for community involvement and to enhance leadership, advocacy, and fundraising skills.

Members receive training from JLT members and community leaders and will have the benefit of interacting with other young women their age from across the community.

DONE IN A DAY

Done in a Day is a series of concentrated projects, which provide volunteer mobilization and funding for community-based events on a short-term basis. JLT partners with other, local non-profit organizations to assist in the execution of community projects that have a significant impact in the Tallahassee area.

This year DIAD completed projects with the following organizations:

Aveanna, Elder Care Services, Ferst Readers, Florida Mission of Mercy, Girl Scouts of Gateway Council, Girls on the Run of the Big Bend, Heart Gallery Big Bend, Judy Field Memorial Foundation, Omega Lamplighters, Southern Shakespeare Company, Springtime Tallahassee, Tallahassee Symphony, TallyRobotics, The Oasis Center for Women & Girls, United Partners For Human Services (UPHS), and WFSU.



PROGRAMS AND HIGHLIGHTS



MIGHTY MEALS

In Spring 2022, JLT Mighty Meals provided 29,400 meals during our food distribution event. Mighty Meals directly fights against childhood hunger and food insecurity by providing nutritious meals to local children and families during the spring break holiday. Each box feeds a family of four, three-nutritious meals each day, for the seven days of spring break.

With help from sponsors and partners, members oversaw the development of the contents, packing, and distribution of each box. We also partnered with UF/IFAS Extension to host an educational cooking class for Sabal Palm Elementary students.



KIDS' BOUTIQUE

In August 2021, the 25th Annual Kids' Boutique, our annual back-to-school shopping event was hosted in partnership with Kohl's. JLT works directly with guidance counselors at local elementary schools to identify children in need of essential clothes, shoes, and school supplies. JLT served **210 local children** through our Summer and Winter Kids' Boutique shopping events.



CAPITAL CITY YOUTH SERVICES

JLT completed its two-year partnership with Capital City Youth Services (CCYS). JLT members served meals, celebrated the holidays, painted residents' bedrooms, hosted donation drives, beautified the outdoor campus, and hosted a field day in collaboration with FSU Football. *CCYS provides guidance, shelter, and support to youth and families in the Big Bend area.*

LITTLE BLACK DRESS INITIATIVE

The Little Black Dress Initiative (LBDI) is a fundraising program in which JLT members and JLT/LBDI advocates wear the same black dress/outfit for five consecutive days to raise awareness about food insecurity experienced by those living in poverty in our community.

The outfit represents the tough choices individuals have to make when they are food insecure. During this week, LBDI advocates invite dialogue among colleagues, friends, and strangers to raise awareness about food insecurity and how it affects our community.
